



What does the law say?


Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) - This is a major component of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). It ensures:

- To the maximum extent possible, children should have the chance to learn alongside their peers who are nondisabled.
- Any time we remove students from the regular education environment, it should only be done so because the nature of the disability is severe. This means the child cannot demonstrate success in the regular education setting, even with aids and services.

Our data is most robust at these grade levels. Kids are still learning how to learn in earlier grades.




Is this the same every year?


Not necessarily - it depends on student needs. Our current model can work well, if there is not a present need.
